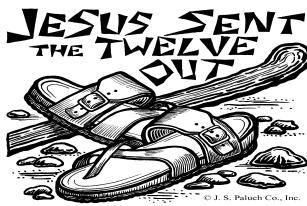

A Reflection on the Gospel from the 2015 Living

Liturgy: Few things in our life carry the natural sense of urgency that serious, unexpected health care issues generate. In this gospel Jesus sends the Twelve out on mission, and the way he does so indicates that there is an urgency about this sending forth.

“Jesus *summoned* the Twelve.” “Summoned” is a significant word here. This is a call that cannot be ignored because the mission is so urgent: to preach repentance. The mission is so urgent that the Twelve are not even to burden themselves with seeming necessities of life. The mission is so urgent that the Twelve are not even to stay with those who do not receive them or listen to them. The mission is so urgent that the Twelve are given Jesus' own authority to expel demons and cure illness. Jesus sends the Twelve off to preach repentance. The mission is so urgent because what is at stake is our relationship with God and each other. Repentance heals the wounds that separate; repentance overflows into forgiveness; repentance changes our behavior; repentance is basic to growth in our covenantal fidelity; repentance make us whole again.

It is an awesome thought that Jesus entrusts his mission to us. We cannot ignore Jesus' command performance to preach repentance. The mission of Jesus is so urgent that he must use others to reach out to all people at all times to bring salvation. But the only way we can be successful is to make sure that our mission is, indeed, that of Jesus. Who Jesus is, disciples are—prophets sent on a mission. With our own power and talent, we can do little; with a deep relationship with Jesus and the realization that we continue his saving work, we can do much.
